VOTE BY MAIL – IT'S NOT TOO LATE!!

Philadelphia and Pennsylvania continue to work to assure safe and secure voting in the General Election. Here's what's new:

Mail-in ballots are on the way! Printing was delayed by a court case, and Philadelphia just began mailing them out, but you should get yours soon if you applied for one. [Click here](#) to see if it's been sent yet. ***Don't mail in a "naked ballot"!***

If you are using a mail-in ballot, be sure to follow the directions carefully:

- Carefully fill in the ballot. Make no marks besides filling in the ovals (unless you are writing in a candidate). If you make a mistake, call **215-686-3469** for a replacement ballot. ***Be sure to fill in both sides!*** Use only blue or black ink; best to use the same pen throughout.
- Seal your ballot in the smaller secrecy envelope, labeled, "Official Election Ballot." ***Ballots not sealed in this envelope - "naked ballots" - will not be counted.*** Don't write or mark the secrecy envelope.
- Seal the secrecy envelope in the larger envelope. Carefully follow the directions about signing it. ***Take care in signing - this signature will be compared with the one on file.***
- Mail it in - allow plenty of time, or drop it off at an official location, such as Roxborough High School (see below) - ***not at a polling place.***

There are new Satellite Election Offices. One just opened in Roxborough High School, 6498 Ridge Ave.. Look for a door next to the main entrance on Ridge Ave. The hours of operation are as follows: 11:30am to 6:30pm, Monday through Thursday, and 9:30am to 4:30pm Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.

Here's what you can do there:

- Register to vote, if needed (***have you moved recently?***). Request a mail-in ballot in-person, receive it, vote, and return it, all at the in the same visit. They print the ballot on the spot, customized for your precinct.
- Drop off your vote-by-mail ballot if you already have one. ***But only your own ballot!*** You can't drop off someone else's ballot unless they've made you a "designated agent." The secure drop-off box is taken to the main Commissioner's office every night.
